I. Call Meeting To Order

The Tourism Development Advisory Committee meeting was called to an order at 9:00 AM.

V. Requests To Address The Committee

Mike Pistone, George Osborne, Johnny Smecca, Becky Gantert, Della Shorman and Wayne Holt addressed the committee regarding item VIII Discuss and Consider Summer Seawall Fireworks.

VI. Discuss And Consider Approval Of Meeting Minutes

Discussion: Shane Cantrell proposed an edit of motion for November 13, 2018 meeting minutes. Proposed Shane Cantrell made a motion to complete a phased-in approach with the goal of eliminating abandoned canopy structures on Galveston's Public beaches. This phased-in approach could include an educational component, new ordinance, or other approaches as needed to reduce and eliminate overnight or abandoned structures.

**Motion:** John Zendt made a motion to approve the minutes with the recommended revised motion.

VII. Present 2018 Holiday Marketing Efforts (Melody Smith, 30 Minutes)

Melody Smith introduced MBuy the media buying company that is handling advertising for the CVB. MBuy presented to the committee the updates on the holiday marketing efforts. Mbuy also informed the committee of some of the changes they will make for the Spring Break Season.

VIII. Discuss And Consider Summer Seawall Fireworks (Meg Winchester, 10 Minutes)

Meg Winchester passed a petition around along with emails received regarding the fireworks. Staff recommends that it is more effective to redeploy the resources for need times The CVB suggested possibly using the funds to focus on the major holiday's such as Memorial Day, July 4<sup>th</sup>, Labor Day, and New Year's Eve fireworks.

There were comments made regarding the discontinuation of the seawall fireworks during the summer months. The concerns mentioned were children and pets being frightened and the environmental concerns surrounding the debris.

The majority of the committee was in agreement that the revenue is up on Sunday during the summer months and with the competitive market the fireworks should be continued.

Kelly de Schaun stated that they are looking more at digital lighting, which is much more costly. De Schaun stated that changing direction mid-year could be a challenge and tasked the committee to consider looking at other options for future years.

**Motion:** John Zendt made a motion that we continue with the fireworks spending the same amount as it is in the budget.

**Second:** Gina Spagnola

Discussion: Shane Cantrell wants to see the committee tackle the issues regarding fireworks past 2020. The fireworks discussion will be placed on the committee agenda for further review.

IX. Discuss And Consider Event Incubator Funding For 2019 Bon Temps Rouler Cajun Throwdown (Bryan Kunz, 10 Minutes)

Daniel and Danielle Guidry presented to the committee the Bon Temps Rouler Cajun Throwdown Event. The Ben Temps Rouler Cajun Throwdown, scheduled for April 26-27, 2019 at Tin Cup's Caddyshack, is a 2-day celebration of all things Cajun. Anchored by an all-you-can-eat crawfish cooking competition and some of the country's best Louisiana Cajun live entertainers, the event is designed to help boost Galveston's economy, give back to the local community and become an annual event where family and friends gather to enjoy Cajun cuisine, music and family atmosphere.

Staff Recommendation:

With the popularity of food and cooking events continuing to rise, as well as the regional and national attention Cajun culture is receiving, staff believes this event could become a great annual addition to our calendar of events. Staff recommends approval of up to \$10,000 in incubator funding.

X. Recap Of 2018 Galveston Fall Flounder Classic (Bryan Kunz, 10 Minutes)

The Fall Flounder event was done in November 2018-December 2018 which is a down time for Galveston. There was a great attendance and the economic numbers were greater than expected. The room nights expected was 180 but the room nights achieved came out to be 300 plus room nights. There were great sponsorships but will try to seek sponsorships earlier. This event qualified to receive funding in the amount of \$8,353.

XI. Recap Of 2018 Galveston Fishing Rodeo (Bryan Kunz, 10 Minutes)

Shane Cantrell gave a recap of the Fishing Rodeo event which took place at the end of September 2018- October 2018. The event was a success with over 40 winners and over 30 sponsors with an attendance of 800 people. Next year they will expand marketing opportunities and will continue to grow the sponsorship. This event qualified to receive funding in the amount of \$10,000.

**Agenda Item:** Discuss and Consider Special Event Solicitation Funding for 2019 The Race of Gentlemen

**Background:**

The Race of Gentlemen, scheduled for November 9-11, 2019, is a vintage automobile and motorcycle drag racing event featuring American-made, pre-1934 cars and pre-1957 motorcycles. The entire event is geared toward recreating the feel of historic beach races that were tremendously popular in the 1930s-1960s in beach towns across the US, including Galveston. Racers, event staff and many spectators dress in period attire, and event infrastructure is designed to replicate that of the era.

Tentative schedule of activities includes:

Friday night car/motorcycle show

Saturday beach races at East Beach

Saturday night bonfire and beach party with live entertainment at East Beach

Sunday beach races at East Beach

The promoter is highly influential in the motorcycle community on a national level and has strong relationships with national manufacturers (Harley-Davidson), sponsors, car clubs, motorcycle clubs and media outlets. They produce this event annually in Wildwood, NJ with huge success. Wildwood attendance ranges upward of 15,000 for the weekend, and the promoter expects 7,000-10,000 the first year in Galveston.

**Staff Recommendation:**

The historic feel of this event fits perfectly with the CVB's ongoing effort to promote Galveston's historic and cultural amenities. The race promises to expose Galveston to a new audience on a national level, and the promoter has shown the ability to generate tremendous media exposure for past events.

Staff believes this is a perfect event for Galveston, and it is scheduled for an ideal timeframe. Staff recommends supporting this event in the amount of \$10,000.
